Lastly, our partnership with the Maxwell Institute and Saint Vincent's Hospital allowed us to initiate the "Leave Behind Naloxone" program. We know that our success is built on public trust and we are committed to strengthening our partnerships to improve the quality of life of every member of our community.



## PATROL DIVISION



#### WORKING AROUND THE CLOCK TO KEEP YOU SAFE

The Patrol Division is the most visible and largest section of the Police Department. The primary focus of the Patrol Division is the protection of life and property and to enforce the law in a fair and impartial manner, consistent with the values of a free and open society. Uniformed Patrol Officers have the most contact with the community. They provide the Village with a full range of police activities that our citizens have come to rely on. They are the first responders to calls of service that run the gamut from a barking dog to an armed encounter. The most inconsequential and routine activity can develop into a potentially hazardous and volatile situation in a split second. Over the past year we experience several major weather events that our Officer's were on high alert for to assure the safety of all our residents.



## KEEPING CITIZENS SAFE DURING SPECIAL EVENTS

The Tuckahoe Police Department, along with our law enforcement partners, the Westchester County Department of Public Safety Emergency Force, the Eastchester Police and Eastchester Auxiliary Police provided a safe route for the 45th Tuckahoe Challenge Race. It was the largest race to date and was a huge success. We hope that other events canceled due to the Pandemic, such as the Annual Fireworks at the Parkway Oval, return this year. We will be at the ready to ensure everyone's safety when they do!





## **DETECTIVE DIVISION**



#### THE DETECTIVE DIVISION

The Tuckahoe Police Department's Detective Division is tasked with the responsibility of investigating all criminal activities, internal investigations and the records management of the entire police department. Detectives act as a liaisons with representatives from federal, state, county, and other municipal agencies. The duties of a Detective may range from obtaining documentation relating to identity theft, to retrieving essential DNA samples at a burglary scene. The Detectives at the Tuckahoe Police Department strive to excel in all aspects of criminology including evidence interrogation, collection, interview and documentation and court testimony. Aside from investigations, the Detectives are also assigned the task of actively pursuing and arresting subjects who evade court proceedings.





**Real Time Crime** 

Real Time Crime (RTC) was established by the Westchester County Police Department in 2017. Detective Sergeant Chris Santiago, Detective Steven Leone and Detective Ashley Tuccitto participate weekly collaborate over 40 other and with police departments. They utilize RTC's resources which a combination of surveillance, includes recognition, and shared license plate databases. One of the largest LPR systems in the USA, RTC scans & archives approximately 40 million plates a month across 220 MOBOTIX cameras. These plates can generate real-time alerts via a robust software platform, and the archived database. This technology has assisted Detectives apprehending suspects.

#### Leave Behind Naloxone

The Tuckahoe Police Department implemented the "Leave Behind Naloxone" initiative. The program equips police officers with naloxone kits for distribution to individuals who are at risk for opioid overdose, or to family or friends who are in a position to help with an overdose crisis. Officers were trained by Lillian Neuman, CASAC, Director of Community Outreach/Education, Saint Vincent's Hospital Westchester and the Maxwell Institute.

## **EMERGENCY RESPONSE UNIT**



#### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE UNIT**

The Tuckahoe Police Departments Emergency Response Unit is a highly trained and skilled tactical team used as a resource for the department in the handling of critical incidents. The use of well managed police tactical units has shown to substantially reduce the risk of injury or loss of life to citizens, police officers and suspects with a high success of favorable resolutions of critical incidents. The Unit trains and deploys with members of the Eastchester Department, Bronxville Police Department, and Pelham Police Department. The team received certification from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services after meeting and exceeding all accreditation standards.

The Emergency Response Unit consists of five active tactical operators, which includes Sergeant Chris Santiago as the Unit's team leader. While emergency call-outs were minimal, the team continued partaking in Operation Hercules exercises and training. Training opportunities have been consistent throughout multi-jurisdictional team training with the Westchester County Police SRT team on a monthly basis. The members continue to be enthusiastic and eager to assist whenever called upon.





#### **OPERATION HERCULES**

Members of the Emergency Response Unit have participated with other jurisdictions, more notably the MTA Police, in order to provide extra security during the holiday season on the rail system. In addition, special attention has been given to high risk security threats related storage facilities and such as houses of worship. While most of our local focus was on both the Tuckahoe Train Station as well as the Crestwood Train Station, the team has increased its presence in neighboring jurisdictions and CTZ3 affiliates.

#### **TRAINING**

Administration from our four municipalities agreed upon a collaborative training schedule with the Westchester County Police SRT (Special Response Team). Over the course of the year, each operator is required to complete a minimum of 96 hrs per year of tactical training which will be led by instructors within the WCDPS staff. Training venues and extensive equipment are now more accessible to our team members. The collaborative effort has been a huge success and further illustrates the importance of multi-agency team work. Sgt. Santiago and Sgt. Pinto their continued training as certified sniper elements.

## CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY UNIT

The CPS unit is comprised of six members, James Kennedy, Police Officers Sergeant Ashley Anthony Solano, Tuccitto Dan Custodian, Coughlin and Police Elliott Maldonado. The Unit hosts annual car Village seat events throughout the and during vear. Over the 2021 events the year dozens of car seats were inspected and installed by our Car Seat Technicians.

#### **MOTORCYCLE UNIT**

The Motor Unit consists of four specially trained officers who operate three fully outfitted Harley-Davidson Glide Electra motorcycles. The motorcycles were purchased, with grant from a the Pope Foundation. Generoso The motorcycles are a very visible means of patrol, with the primary function of traffic enforcement. The maneuverability of the motorcycles and the ability to accelerate quickly make them excellent tools to enforce speeding violations other and traffic offenses. the added The goal of enforcement is to increase traffic safety and decrease motor vehicle accidents. They maneuver through traffic for improved response time and reach areas such as parks that are not easily accessed by patrol cars. ## **SPECIAL UNITS**



#### TRAFFIC SAFETY UNIT

The Traffic Safety Unit was formed in 2020 and is comprised of five Members, Sgt. Kennedy, Sgt. Harris, P.O. Ramirez, P.O. Solano, and P.O. Tuccitto. The unit holds monthly traffic details that targets drivers under the influence, unsafe commercial vehicles, vehicles failing to yield to pedestrians, motorists using cellular phones without hands free devices, along with many other targeted enforcement areas. This past year the unit was limited with enforcement details due to COVID, but they did complete three days of details before the pandemic which resulted in 91 summonses being issued. The summonses issued were mainly for commercial vehicle violations and seat belt violations.





#### **BICYCLE PATROL UNIT**

The Bicycle Patrol Unit was in operation from July 1st through October 31st. The high profile, proactive bicycle promotes positive public relations, deters serious crimes, addresses quality of life complaints and fosters and maintains the commitment to the community policing philosophy. Members of the unit patrolled 47 tours in 2021. Almost all members of the Department in their career have taken the treacherous five day Police Mountain Bike Patrol Course.

## **YOUTH SERVICES**



#### **YOUTH SERVICES**

The Tuckahoe Police Department continues to be affected by the Covid 19 pandemic, however our agency still made strong efforts to continue our goal of serving our community. Some minor adjustments were made in various programs and community outreach concepts but many programs were able to take place as pandemic restrictions were less stringent.

The Tuckahoe Police Department currently has six Youth Officers: Lt. Zirolnik, Det/Sgt. Santiago, Det. Leone, P.O. Piasta, P.O. Solano and P.O. Tuccitto.

- The Tuckahoe Police Department accepted two High School interns into our department Intern (WISE Program.) Additionally, one college student from Iona College. The interns worked under the supervision of Lt. Zirolnik and Lt. Rotta and were involved in various departmental projects and observed daily operations. The internship program has been a great success and we were happy to host the students this year following the 2020 pandemic cancellation.
- There were **five juvenile cards/juvenile activity reports** forwarded to the Youth Division for follow up by our Youth Officers. These juveniles may have been involved in activity that would have constituted a crime, but due to their age they were referred to the Youth Division for appropriate consequences.
- P.O. Piasta taught the 5th Grade D.A.R.E. Program at the William E. Cottle Elementary school. There were approximately 100 students who received ten weeks of instruction utilizing the new "Keep it Real" curriculum which was culminated with a virtual graduation ceremony.



#### **EXPLORER PROGRAM**

The Tuckahoe Police Explorer Program is up and running again as of October with 14 active Explorers. Post #2008 had approx. 22 regular meetings throughout the school year, which included community service opportunities for all of the enrolled Explorers. The Explorer Program runs every other Wednesday, from 5:30PM-7:30PM, September-June at the Tuckahoe Police Department. The two advisors are Officer Piasta and Officer Madan.

## TRAFFIC SAFETY



#### TRAFFIC SAFETY AWARDS

The Tuckahoe Police Department was the recipient of the Automobile Association of America's Gold Award. The award was bestowed for the Department's superior programs and projects that address local traffic safety. This is the fourteenth consecutive year that the Department has been recognized with the prestigious award by the AAA. The award was given to the Police Department for our effectiveness in addressing local traffic safety issues, by implementing superior programs and projects such as:

- Safe Riders Day Bicycle Safety Education
- STOP-DWI / Safe and Sober Campaigns Driving Under the Influence enforcement and education.
- Buckle Up New York Adult and child restraint enforcement and education.
- Operation Safe Stop School Bus enforcement and education.

These programs, among other efforts resulted in no DWI related fatal or serious injury accidents, no serious bicycle accidents, no serious school bus accidents, and a high compliance rate of occupant protection for the past 20 years. The Department also received a commendation for 47 consecutive years without a pedestrian fatality.
