Item #1 Approval of minutes for the March 10, April 21, October 6, November 17, 2022, and January 25, 2023 meetings

Chairperson Steinhagen motioned to approve the minutes for the March 10, April 21, October 26, November 17, and January 25, 2023 meetings

The motion was seconded by member Gaccione and was carried by the Commission with a vote of 2-0.

Item #2 Discussion: Overview of the Certified Local Government Program

Chairperson Steinhagen gave an overview of the Certified Local Government Program, the requirements to become a Certified Local Government, the application process, and the benefits of becoming a Certified Local Government, including access to grant funding.

Item #3 Discussion: Recognition of the historic Tuckahoe sites included in the Tuckahoe Master Plan

Member Luisi discussed the historic sites included in the Tuckahoe Master Plan, including the Generoso Pope Building, the Old Stone Cotton Mill, the Hodgman Rubber Company, also known as the Revlon Building, and the Tuckahoe Metro-North Rail Station.

Member Abrams noted that the Commission will also look at the Main Street School, which is now Village Hall, and Depot Square.

Chairperson Steinhagen stated that the Commission would examine these sites closely in the future.

Chairperson Steinhagen also noted that while the Old Stone Mill is not entirely in the Village of Tuckahoe, part of the structure is situated in Tuckahoe, making the structure eligible to be designated as a local historic landmark.
