Members of the Tuckahoe Police Department attended the Sanford Gardens Community Block Party. Inflatable sporting games were provided as well as prizes and giveaways. Members of the Police Department enjoyed interacting with residents in various games and being in one anothers company.

#### **TORCH RUN**

Every year, the Tuckahoe Police Department participates in the Westchester County leg Law Enforcement Torch Run Annual Special Olympics. Officers from across the County join together for this event with mission to promote the Special Olympics and the "Flame of Hope" as it makes its way protect the opening of the Annual Summer toward Games. The Torch Run comes to our area in May of each year.

### PATROL DIVISION



#### WORKING AROUND THE CLOCK TO KEEP YOU SAFE

The Patrol Division is the most visible and largest section of the Police Department. The primary focus of the Patrol Division is the protection of life and property and to enforce the law in a fair and impartial manner, consistent with the values of a free and open society. Uniformed Patrol Officers have the most contact with the community. They provide the Village with a full range of police activities that our citizens have come to rely on. They are the first responders to calls of service that run the gamut from a barking dog to an armed encounter. The most inconsequential and routine activity can develop into a potentially hazardous and volatile situation in a split second









#### KEEPING CITIZENS SAFE DURING SPECIAL EVENTS

The Village of Tuckahoe hold several special events throughout the year that are patrolled by the Tuckahoe Police Department. Some of these events include: the July Fireworks Event at Parkway Oval, The 5K Run in in September, and numerous other events that are held in the Depot Square area during the year.





### **DETECTIVE DIVISION**



#### THE DECTECTIVE DIVISION

The Tuckahoe Police Department's Detective Division is in charge with the responsibility of investigating all criminal activities, internal investigations and the records management of the entire police department. The duties of a Detective may range from obtaining documentation relating to harassing/annoying phone calls, to retrieving essential DNA samples at a burglary scene. The Detectives at the Tuckahoe Police Department strive to excel in all aspects of criminology including evidence collection, interview interrogation, case documentation and court testimony. Aside from investigations, the Detectives are also assigned to the task of actively pursuing and arresting those subjects who evade court proceedings. In 2018 the Detective Division vacated out 10 active warrants for subjects wanted by the Tuckahoe Police Department for various crimes.







## THE ALCOHOL AND DRUG ENFORCMENT TASK FORCE

The Town of Eastchester, and the Villages of Tuckahoe, Bronxville and Scarsdale reformed its Alcohol and Drug Enforcement Task Force over the last year. The task force is run out of the Detective Division who work tirelessly, following up on leads obtained through police duties. The cooperative efforts of the task force focus on the sale and consumption of illegal drugs and the sale of alcohol to minors, as well as, underage drinking. The "B.E.S.T.A.D.E." Task Force is comprised of members of all four departments assigned on a part-time basis. Police Officer Steven Leone is assigned to the task force. Members work in tandem with neighboring jurisdictions to strengthen enforcement and awareness. The collaborative effort of the task force has been very successful and has achieved results that could not have been attained working independently.


### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE UNIT**



#### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE UNIT**

The Tuckahoe Police Departments Emergency Response Unit is a highly trained and skilled tactical team used as a resource for the department in the handling of critical incidents. The use of well managed police tactical units has shown to substantially reduce the risk of injury or loss of life to citizens, police officers and suspects with a high success of favorable resolutions of critical incidents. The Unit trains and deploys with members of the Eastchester Police Department, Bronxville Department, and Pelham Police Department. The team received certification from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services after meeting and exceeding all accreditation standards.

The Emergency Response Unit consists of five active tactical operators. Lt. Zirolnik will continue to be the multi-jurisdictional Team Commander. While emergency call-outs were minimal, the team continued partaking in Operation Hercules exercises and training. Training opportunities have been consistent through out multi-jurisdictional team training with the Westchester County Police SRT team on a monthly basic. The members continue to be enthusiastic and eager to assist whenever called upon.





#### **OPERATION HERCULES**

Members of the Emergency Response Unit have participated with other jurisdictions, more notably the MTA Police, in order to provide extra security during the holiday season on the rail system. In addition, special attention has been given to high risk security threats related to terrorism, such as storage facilities and houses of worship. While most of our local focus was on both the Tuckahoe Train Station as well as the Crestwood Train Station, the team has increased its presence in neighboring jurisdictions and CTZ3 affiliates.

#### **CALL-OUTS**

In August, members of the Emergency Response Unit responded for an area search of a robbery suspect in the Town of Eastchester. The suspect was found and apprehended without incident.

#### DIGNITARY PROTECTION

Team members provided personal protection to high profile dignitaries at public events on two occasions.

#### **TRAINING**

Team members participate in a collaborative training schedule with the Westchester County Police SRT (Special Response Team). Over the course of the year, each operator completed a minimum of 96 hours of tactical training. This shared service allows for training venues and extensive equipment accessible to our team members. The collaborative effort has been a huge success and further illustrates the importance of multi-agency team work.

### SPECIAL UNITS



#### CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY UNIT

The CPS unit is comprised of six members, Sergeant James Kennedy, Detective Andrea Pinto, Police Officers Anthony Solano (Unit Leader), Ashley Tuccitto, Dan Coughlin and Police Custodian Person, Elliott Maldonado. The Unit hosted a seat check event on June 2nd at the Eastchester Town Hall with the Eastchester Police Department in conjunction with the department's Bicycle Safety Event. The Unit checked/installed 21 child safety seats at the event.

- On September 29th, the Unit assisted the Ardsley Police Department host a CPS Event in their jurisdiction. Eight new seats were installed and several others inspected.
- 35 Vehicles were checked by appointment or walk-in at Tuckahoe Police Headquarters in 2018.
- Over 64 child safety seats were inspected or installed in 2018.
- -Four new seats were provided and installed free of charge to those whose existing seats were defective.



### **BICYCLE PATROL UNIT**

The Bicycle Patrol Unit was in operation from May 1st through October 31st. The high profile, proactive bicycle promotes positive public relations, deters serious crimes, addresses quality of life complaints and fosters and maintains the commitment to the community policing philosophy. Members of the unit patrolled 66 tours in 2018



#### MOTORCYCLE UNIT

The Motor Unit consists of four specially trained officers who operate three fully outfitted Harley-Davidson Electra Glide motorcycles. motorcycles were purchased, with a grant from Generoso Pope Foundation. motorcycles are a very visible means of patrol, with the primary function of traffic enforcement. The maneuverability of the motorcycles and the ability to accelerate quickly make them excellent tools to enforce speeding violations and other traffic offenses. The goal of the added enforcement is to increase traffic safety and decrease motor vehicle accidents. maneuver through traffic for improved response time and reach areas such as parks that are not easily accessed by patrol cars. In addition, the unit participated in over 15 ceremonial escorts, which included funeral escorts, parades, charity rides and the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics.

### **YOUTH SERVICES**



#### **YOUTH SERVICES**

The Tuckahoe Police Department currently has six Youth Officers: Lt Zirolnik, Sgt. Santiago, P.O. S. Leone, P.O. Piasta, P.O. Solano and P.O. Tuccitto.

- January 2018, The Tuckahoe Police Department accepted a student from Iona College into our Department's Intern Program. The intern, whose studies focused in Criminal Justice, worked under the supervision of Lt. Andrew Zirolnik and completed 104+ internship hours. In addition, the Tuckahoe Police Department accepted an Eastchester High School student, as well as a Tuckahoe High School student to complete their WISE Internship under supervision of Lt Zirolnik.
- There were 2 youths mandated by the Village of Tuckahoe Court to our Community Service Alcohol/Drug Awareness classes and Service Program in 2018. The Court imposed a \$75.00 administrative fee for these classes. This fee is payable on the day of the class, and is directly used toward the cost of running this program. These classes are instructed by Sgt. Santiago, P.O. S. Leone and P.O. Piasta at the Village of Tuckahoe Police Department.
- There were **four juveniles** who were **diverted from the Juvenile Justice System** by our Youth Division and given Community Service Classes and hours relevant to the specific offense.
- There were **five juvenile cards/juvenile activity reports** forwarded to the Youth Division for follow up by our Youth Officers. These juveniles may have been involved in activity that would have constituted a crime, but due to their age they were referred to the Youth Division for appropriate consequences.
- P.O. Piasta taught the 5th Grade D.A.R.E. Program at the William E. Cottle Elementary school. There were approximately 110 students who received ten weeks of instruction utilizing the new "Keep it Real" curriculum which was culminated with a graduation ceremony in June of 2018
- P.O. S. Leone taught the D.A.R.E. curriculum to the Tuckahoe Middle School's 7th grade class. There were approximately 90 students who received ten weeks of instruction in the Middle School curriculum.



#### **EXPLORER PROGRAM**

The Tuckahoe Police Explorer Program ended the 2018 year with 12 active Explorers. Post #2008 had 22 regular meetings throughout the year, with additional trips and community service opportunities for all of the enrolled Explorers. The Explorer Program meets every other Wednesday from 5:30PM-7:30PM September to June, at the Tuckahoe Police Department. The two advisors are Sgt. Santiago and P.O. Piasta. This past year, the Explorers attended a CPR Certification Course, took field trips and participated in group challenges, as well as team building exercises.

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY AWARDS


The Tuckahoe Police Department was the recipient of the Automobile Association of America's Gold Award. It was bestowed for the Department's superior programs and projects that address local traffic safety. This is the twelfth consecutive year that the Department has been recognized with the prestigious award by the AAA. The award was given to the Police Department's for our effectiveness in addressing local traffic safety issues, by implementing superior programs and projects such as:

- Safe Riders Day Bicycle Safety Education
- STOP-DWI / Safe and Sober Campaigns Driving Under the Influence enforcement and education.
- Buckle Up New York Adult and child restraint enforcement and education.
- Operation Safe Stop School Bus enforcement and education.

These programs, among other efforts resulted in no DWI related fatal or serious injury accidents, no serious bicycle accidents, no serious school bus accidents, and a high compliance rate of occupant protection for the past 18 years. The Department also received a commendation for 44 consecutive years without a pedestrian fatality.
