Item #1 Approval of Minutes – October 19, 2010

Member Nieminen motioned to approve the minutes of the October 19, 2010 meeting. This motion was seconded by Member Pushkal and unanimously carried by the Board with a vote of 3-0.

Item #2 4 Depot Square New Arm Sign

Brian McLynn of San Signs, representing Antiques & Consignments, presented an application for an Arm Sign to hang underneath the awning, with post secured to façade. The sign is 3 feet wide and 1 foot high. The letters are 3 inches in height. The sign will also be double sided. It will hang 8 feet, 8 inches above grade. The color will be green with gold leaf lettering. Chairwoman Ciaramella asked if the arm sign is a twisted bracket, so that it will be uniform with the other arm signs in the Village. Discussion regarding the size of the sign and the font size took place.

Applicant was asked to return with a new drawing to scale showing the sign size to be 30 inches by 12 inches. He was also asked to reduce the font size to fit appropriately with the size of the sign. The colors will remain the same. The sign will be anchored to the façade. It should be a spiral twist arm sign to conform to other arm signs.

Item #3 Wells Fargo New Sign

A motion was made to approve the application as presented via email with letter size to be 15 inches high, background color brown and letter color being golden yellow by Chairwoman Ciaramella, second by Member Pushkal and unanimously carried by the board with a vote of 3-0.

Item #4 VIP Wine and Liquor**Renew TV Monitor**

Victor Pali, owner of VIP Wine and Liquor, presented an application to renew his permit to allow him to keep the TV monitor in the window. He requested that we extend the permit for an additional 3 years. Discussion regarding the effect the TV Monitor has had on his business took place. There has been no negative feedback to our Board, the Building Inspector or Mr. Pali regarding the TV Monitor.

A motion was made by Member Pushkal, second by Member Nieminen to approve the application as presented for an additional 3 years with the stipulation that if issues arise regarding the monitor, that the file will be opened and the situation will be addressed was unanimously carried by the board with a vote of 3-0.

There being no further comments from the public or business before the Board, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 2:25 pm.
