## Tuckahoe Kids Table: Project Proposal October 13, 2021

## Proposed to: Mayor Omayra Andino by Hudson Leo Axelbaum and Dada and Mama Axelbaum.

## **Hudson:**

What: Making a stand for kids to sell things to benefit the community

Why: To raise money for our community

Who: People who come by the stand

Where: At the Farmer's Market or at our driveway

When: Every Sunday at the Farmer's Market

**How**: Kids can sign up and we can post it online. Kids would come and everybody would have a turn every Sunday. They can sell hot cocoa, lemonade, apple cider, cookies, cereal, toys, and crafts. People can give the money they want (like they can give \$1 or \$100).

## From the grown-ups:

- Goals:
  - Community engagement: Get community more involved with the village with more touchpoints for how to help/donate
  - Learning opportunity for kids: Get kids more involved in civic duty and understanding some things about business (What is cost of goods? How much do you need to "sell" it for?)
  - Marketing/PR opportunity: promote good will for our local politicians that is completely apolitical
- Marketing aspect:
  - Opportunity for good PR for Omayra and team that is totally neutral
  - Create a feel-good moment for people to connect with local team
  - Calling it the "Mayor's Table" or something like that will help promote Omayra to the community
  - Ongoing means it can be a campaign that keeps positive touch points for Omayra and team to the village
- ideas:
  - Run an application time for kids to send proposals for what they want to use the table for and what they will sell
    - Have a curated list of charities that support the village ahead of time (Tuckahoe Beautification, Library, Green committee, etc)
  - Takeaway "gifts" during holiday season (hot cocoa jars, crafts, etc)
  - Families who get selected responsible for their cost of goods and set up
- Considerations:
  - Farmer's Market best place?
    - Is there a power source there if kids want to sell hot chocolate, etc?
  - How to market it
  - Empty store front used for "pop up" shop?
